SPANISH INSTRUCTION (GRADES 3-8)

AFTERNOON DRAMA PROGRAM (GRADES 3-8)

Practice acting techniques and bring your talents to fruition as you plan, organize, and rehearse a production for your parents on Family Nights. You will have plenty of opportunities to express yourself as you enjoy theatre games and exercises. Learn about theatre make-up and costuming, simple sets, and all the peripherals that make you a believable actor or actress.

SWIMMING (ALL AGES)

Enjoy a cool dip in the Claremont High School pool. Daily lessons are provided for every swimming level, followed by recreational swimming. Red Cross certified instructors and lifeguards as well as counselors supervise the program.

AFTERNOON COMPUTER (GRADES 4-8)

SESSION 1: INTERNET TREASURE HUNT

Discover the hidden treasures of the worldwide web through search engines using Boolean logic. Through technological tools learn short cuts to research the mysteries of the world.

SESSION 2: BIGGER & BETTER

Begin with the same photos as your classmates and manipulate them through creative image editing. Retouch, balance the color, and add adjustment layers using Adobe Photoshop and Picasa to customize your photos. Exhibit your final product in a PowerPoint slideshow. This is what Andy Warhol would be doing with digital photography today.

VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS (GRADES K-2)

Venture into the world of artistic expression through art, music, song, dance, drama, and creative play. Participatory activities vary to accommodate the young, eager, and artistic minds. Enjoy performing, creating, and listening to stories about accomplished people in these areas.

PROJECT THINK is a non-profit academic program designed to stimulate and motivate students to reach out to a wide variety of interest areas. Exceptional educators motivate children to develop thinking skills which will enable them to participate and succeed in a growing, challenging twenty-first century. Emphasis is on active learning; children learn by using all of their senses in hands-on activities.

Walking field trips and professional guest speakers enhance the program. Master credentialed teachers, classroom aides, and specialists provide a small ratio of students to instructor, enabling them to offer small group and individual instruction.

Students may register for either one or both of the 3-week sessions as teachers plan a variety of curriculum choices to stimulate the children's curiosity and interest for the entire period.

Students, 3rd - 8th grades, grouped according to grade level will rotate through all of the six classes below. Children entering kindergarten through second grade attend the "Young Thinkers" classes enjoying learning centers in self-contained classrooms.

A.M. SESSIONS FOR STUDENTS GRADES 3-8

COMPUTERS

SESSION 1: CH-CH-CHANGES

Learn the mysteries of creating two different versions of one photo using Adobe Photoshop's powerful tools. See if others can determine what is different about the two images using tricks of the trade such as the clone stamp tool, replace color, and the healing brush.

SESSION 2: YOU SPY

Design your own digital version of I Spy using Adobe Photoshop. Have your friends find the objects hidden in the composite pictures that you create using realistic lighting and masking.

ART: WONDERS OF THE WORLD

Immerse yourself in the many mysteries and wonders of our natural world. You will learn drawing techniques, color, value, and perspective and use a variety of media to bring these wonders alive on paper. From the Polar Aurora, to the Great Wall of China, to the Taj Mahal, and many others, you will discover their mysterious characteristics, while recreating your own masterpieces.

LITERATURE AND WRITING: MYSTERY FESTIVAL

Join us in a Mystery Festival! Solve a classroom mystery combining fun and excitement with careful experimentation, logical thinking, and real-life connections. Learn to use special crime lab procedures including thread tests, powder tests, DNA comparison, chromatography, and fingerprinting to help you write your own mystery. With clues that you have devised, can your fellow students solve your mystery? Curriculum is varied for each session.

SCIENCE:

MYSTERIES OF MATTER

Mix chemicals that bubble, change color, get hot, and produce gas, heat and odor to discover the mysterious properties of matter. As scientific detectives, you will explore pigments, the concept of solubility, and the separation of mixtures as well as learn about chromatography. What secret formulas await you each session? Focus is on learning by experimentation.

DRAMA CLASS

Learn to use your imaginations to develop captivating stage presence and build confidence. Reach into the minds of the audience as you move and react, using all your senses. Improvisation, theatre games, and exercises will help you explore the hidden talents each one of you possesses.

THINK TANK:

PROBLEM SOLVING

Using your logic and reasoning skills, solve perplexing puzzles and conundrums with your classmates. Clues will help you solve mathematical mysteries and word games. This class is designed to stretch your thinking abilities and deductive reasoning.



Young Thinkers - Grades K-2

Young Thinkers (children going into kindergarten, first, or second grades in the fall of 2012) experience the world around them through hands-on activities. Young Thinkers will adventure into learning as they rotate through centers engaging in language arts, math, computers, science, geography, art, music, and movement. Special emphasis will be placed on phonemic awareness, number sense, and educational standards developed by the State according to developmental stages of learning. As curious sleuths, they will enjoy a variety of readiness activities to prepare them to be lifetime learners. Children will develop perceptiveness and originality and gain self esteem as they interact in small groups under the direction of a team of experienced educators. Special visitors will add to the stimulating learning environment.
